Ordinance Reminders

7-1-4: BURNING OF WASTE MATERIALS:

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to burn waste materials within the village limits, except as regulated herein. Any person violating this section shall be punishable as provided in section 1-4-1 of this code.

UNLIMITED GARBAGE PICKUP Monday, May 15th - Friday May 19th

The Village of Minooka has partnered with NuWay Disposal to



offer an unlimited garbage pickup!

- All garbage must be at the curb by 5:00 AM on your normal pickup day only!
- Additional refuse must be bagged or placed in a can not exceeding 32 gal. or 50 lbs.
- Loose items such as carpet should be bundled with twin, no more than 4 ft. in length.
- Place extra items at least 2 ft from the garbage & recycling totes. Do not place items between the tote and the curb.
- Up to 4 automobile tires, without rims, will be accepted.
- Up to 2 white goods (refrigerator, washer, dryer, etc.) will be accepted
- Hazardous materials (batteries, gasoline, motor oil, etc.) will NOT be accepted.
- Electronics (television, computers, cell phones, etc.) will NOT be accepted.
- Construction material will NOT be accepted







Our stories are filled with joy and wonder, but also with pain and struggle. Some of the deepest hurts I have carried through life have come from my past. Specifically, from difficulties in my story that I didn't learn from, so that pain became pain I passed along to others... in my marriage, family and professional settings. If you and I, as we journey along, are ever going to find the peace that we are all looking for inside of us, and between us, two things need to happen:

- 1. We need to address anything in us that is causing us to be unsettled, restless, angry, anxious, or fearful. In other words, we need to learn from the past. Even though that process might be painful.
- 2. We need to let it go. What does letting it go look like? It looks like you finally saying, "I forgive you." It looks like making a phone call and saying, "I. Was. Wrong." It looks like serving others as a way to process the difficulties that you have, helping you to appropriately put your story in perspective. Someone once said: "Don't waste your pain." Learn from it.

One last thought: The greatest hurt comes to us in relationship, and the greatest healing comes to us in relationship. We need each other. We need to not be afraid to tell each other our stories so we can encourage each other. Above all, we need to be present to each other in genuine care and love. - iii. 625 ILCS 5/11-1426.1Operation of non-highways vehicles on streets, roads and highways
- iv. 625 ILCS 5/11-1427 Illegal Operation of an all-terrain vehicle or off- highway motorcycle
